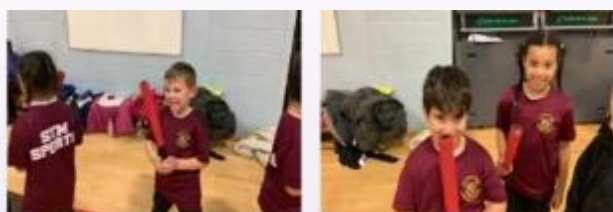

On this day, children (and adults) can come to school in their pyjamas/dressing gowns/onesies/relaxing at home clothes (suitable footwear should be worn).

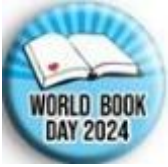
We are asking for a donation of £1 per child

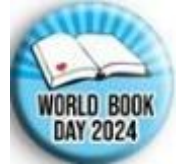


The child who has chosen the winning name will receive a small cuddly teddy bear

WORLD BOOK DAY 2024

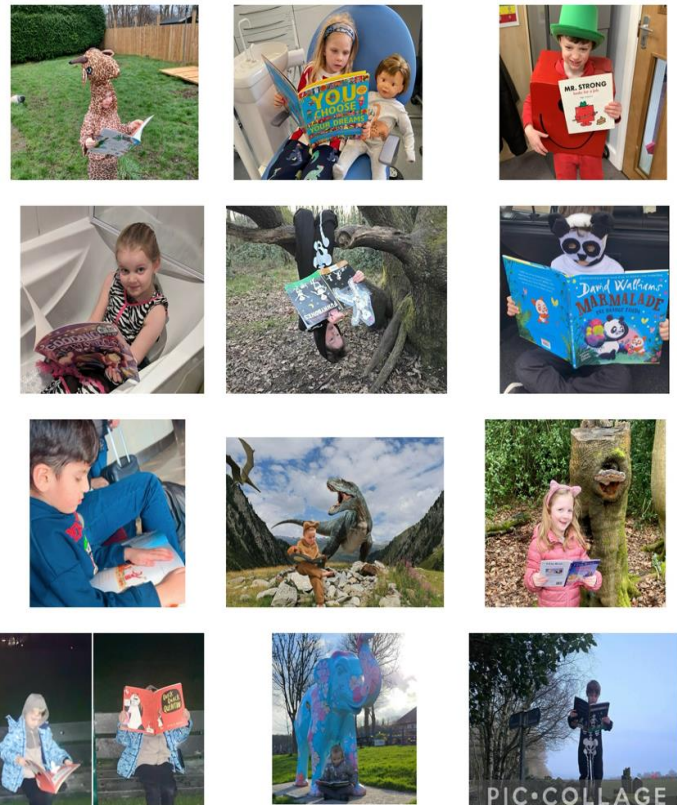
Students had such a fabulous time for World Book Day this week and enjoyed taking part in various activities throughout the day, immersing themselves in the amazing world of books!

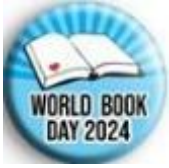


F2 really enjoyed dressing up as their favourite book characters! They went on an adventure around the school to look for clues to try and figure out which character was causing mischief!
Can you guess which character it was from the photos to the left?

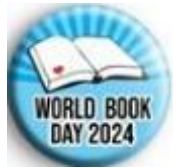

World Book Day – Thursday 7th March 2024



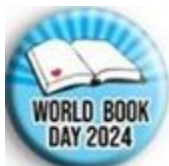

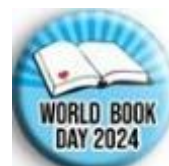

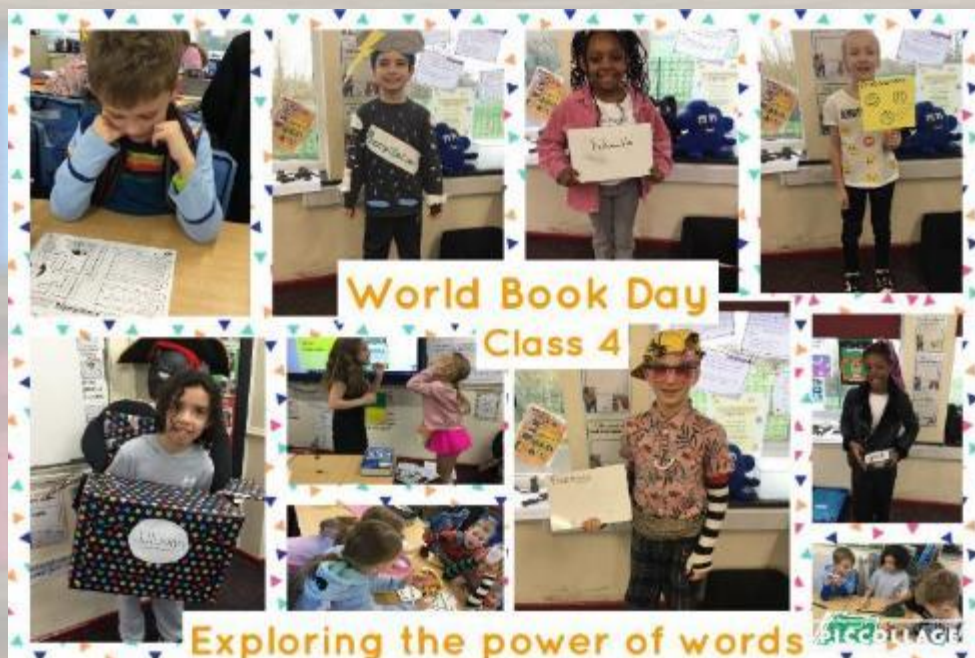

Each year, staff at STM look forward to dressing up for World Book Day and this year was no exception! Staff had a lot of fun dressing up as some of their favourite characters from their favourite books!





British Science Week 8th- 17th March 2024



During British Science Week, children will be taking part in exciting activities linked to this year's theme of Time. Take a look below to see what your class will be doing during British Science Week:

F2	See & Eat Grow a Beanstalk F2 will explore the life cycle of a vegetable, following its journey from root to harvest. They will plant their own green beans and describe the different stages of their growth.
Y1	Changing apples Class 1 will delve into the world of apple varieties. They'll use their sense to describe the apples' appearances and textures, and even taste them! They'll discover the smallest, tallest and widest varieties, and observe apple cores over time.
Y2	Nature's Future Nature in the UK is in trouble – its future is in our hands! Can you imagine a better future for nature on our school grounds? Class 2 will be taking action together to make a change!
Y3	Can you use the sun to tell the time? Before clocks were invented, people told the time using sundials. Class 3 will be making a gnomon (the projecting piece of a sundial) from a selection of materials and observing how the shadow cast by it changes during the day.
Y4	The Big Plastic Count: It's time for change! The Big Plastic Count (11-17 th March) is the UK's biggest household plastic waste investigation. Class 4 will be joining thousands of schools and households across the UK by counting how much plastic waste they throw away, gathering vital evidence to present the true scale of the problem to the government. Keep an eye out on our class dojo page for further information!
Y5	Make your own pendulum timer! Class 5 will be becoming engineers by learning about pendulums and making one themselves. They'll experiment with ways to slow down its swing and even explore different types of swings. Are you up to the challenge Class 5?
Y6	Design a farm of the future! Farming is often described as the 'world's oldest profession,' but what does the future hold for farming? There are over 8 billion people on Earth, up from only 1 billion in the year 1800. Class 6 will be exploring how farmers can rise to the challenge of feeding everyone whilst also looking after our planet.

The British Science Week 2024 Poster Competition

STM will be taking part in British Science Week 2024 (8-17th March 2024), which marks the Week's 30th anniversary. The theme this year is 'Time' - there are loads of STEM topics to be explored!

Children could create a poster showing how a certain type of technology has changed over time, or even the advancement of time-telling technology itself. Budding poster makers could go futuristic by showing how the world might look in years to come, or perhaps look at nature - lifecycles, lifespans and hibernation - nature is full of timely topics!

How will the posters be judged?

The judges at the British Science Association will be looking for:

- **Creativity** - Innovative angle on the content or creative interpretation of the time
 - don't be afraid to think outside the box!
- **Content** - Clear, accurate and informative about a STEM topic
- **Effective Communication** - Communicated in an engaging way

The judges will choose a winner from the following age categories: Early years, Infant (Y1-Y3) and junior (Y4-Y6).

What are the prizes?!

Prizes for 2024 competition winners include: memberships for My Science Club, A collection of Science Works books, space-themed 3D building playsets, A Day in the Life...books, WWF adoption pack and many more!

Entries must be 1 page of A4 or A3 only. Please hand in your poster competition entries to Mrs Butterworth no later than Friday 22nd March.

The top five poster entries will be revealed in assembly and submitted by Mrs Butterworth into the competition.

SEND Parents' Session



From recent feedback from parents, we have decided to have our next SEND parents meet-up during an afternoon session rather than morning so that more parents can attend. The session will be on:

Tuesday 16th April 3:30pm-5pm.

The sessions are specifically aimed at those parents who have a child in school with a special educational need and/or disability. However, the sessions are inclusive so therefore all parents/carers of children attending our school are welcome.

These sessions are designed to share information about provision in school; share links with key agencies; share opportunities for our children with SEND within the community as well as the opportunity for parents/carers to informally meet one another, share experiences and ask questions. It is always great to realise that you are not alone on this journey; there are many parents treading a similar path!

For this session, we are very lucky to have an Educational Psychologist attending: Dr Josie Faure Walker. She will be delivering a short workshop to support parents with dealing with emotional and mental health. She will give some key information about emotional dysregulation, sensory needs and strategies to support children.

These sessions will take place every half term and I hope in the future to invite other key professionals to join each as guest speakers to allow you find out more about their service, ask questions and collect some hints and tips.

STM Projects



Each half term, our children are being given a project to complete at home. The projects that we have designed link to an area of the curriculum that your child/children will be learning about during that half term. Below are the projects for your children. Your class teacher will be providing some inspiration for these on your Class Dojo next Monday. We can't wait to see what you produce and look forward to displaying them around school!

Returning the projects: You can return the projects at any point throughout this term but please be aware that the final date for their return is **Wednesday 27th March**.

Spring Term 2	
EYFS	<i>Please see Dojo for information about a wider range of activities to support learning across all aspects of EYFS</i>
Y1	Leaf and flower rubbing: Collect some flowers and leaves, place paper on top of them and rub with crayons or chalk to create a wonderful piece of art! Challenge: Can you spot 2 evergreen trees and 2 deciduous trees? Write some facts about their appearance.
Y2	Map of the world: Create an artistic Map of the world that has a focus on the continents and oceans. Challenge: Pick a country from a continent on the map and create a fact file about it.
Y3	What is it like in Sheffield? Create a piece of artwork, depicting the landscape and history of Sheffield. Challenge: Write a report about how the landscape of Sheffield has changed over time.
Y4	Biomes: Create a model of your chosen biome inside a box e.g. tundra, desert, tropical rainforest. Include some of the plant and animal species found in your chosen biome. Challenge: Write a non-chronological report about the biome that you have chosen.
Y5	Blast off: Create a rocket and evidence its 'take-off'. Produce a poster of your rocket upon its completion, and label the forces at play as it sets off. Challenge: Create a script which you can read over the top of your rocket setting off. This script should have information around the specific forces which are taking place.
Y6	Healthy Me! Consider the ways in which you can take care of both your physical and your mental health. Create a booklet or a PowerPoint presentation as a guide to help someone live a healthy lifestyle. Challenge: Write a letter to the Prime Minister asking him to consider something to improve health (e.g. ban the sale of cigarettes, improve free sports clubs in the city).
