Attendance – Penalty Notice Fines for Schools

Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance are Changing!

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued after 19th August 2024.

Per Parent, Per Child

Penalty Notice Fines will now be issued to each parent, for each child that was absent.

For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

5 consecutive days of term time leave

Penalty Notice Fines will be issued for Term Time Leave of 5 or more consecutive days. Inset training days are school days and can be included in the 5 or more consecutive days where there was intent to be absent for term time leave.

10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

Second Offence (within 3 years)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates' fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate, due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.

Parking Outside School

Please:

- Avoid parking in a way which causes difficulty for residents – imagine how you would feel if you couldn't access your driveway or garage because someone is parked across it
- Avoid parking/stopping on zig zag lines/double yellow lines and obstructing visibility for pedestrians – the zig zags/double yellows are there for a reason
- Speak politely to each other about parking - children are watching and listening, and they take their lead from adults

SEND Parents' Session



From recent feedback from parents, we have decided to have our next SEND parents meet-up during an afternoon session rather than morning so that more parents can attend. The session will be on:

Tuesday 16 April 2024 - 3:30pm-5pm.

The sessions are specifically aimed at those parents who have a child in school with a special educational need and/or disability. However, the sessions are inclusive so therefore all parents/carers of children attending our school are welcome.

These sessions are designed to share information about provision in school; share links with key agencies; share opportunities for our children with SEND within the community as well as the opportunity for parents/carers to informally meet one another, share experiences and ask questions. It is always great to realise that you are not alone on this journey; there are many parents treading a similar path!

For this session, we are very lucky to have an Educational Psychologist attending: Dr Josie Faure Walker. She will be delivering a short workshop to support parents with dealing with emotional and mental health. She will give some key information about emotional dysregulation, sensory needs and strategies to support children.

These sessions will take place every half term and I hope in the future to invite other key professionals to join each as guest speakers to allow you find out more about their service, ask questions and collect some hints and tips.

Welcome to the latest issue of Helpful Hints from the 0-19 Service at Sheffield Children's. This newsletter is written for parents and carers, and provides regular useful information throughout the year.

Where can I get my child vaccinated?



[In the last Helpful Hints newsletter](#), we talked about Measles and the problems it can cause. So this time we wanted to share where you can catch up with vaccinations in Spring 2024.

Measles is a highly infectious, serious illness that can be very unpleasant. It's more than just a rash – it can cause blindness, sepsis and meningitis. The best protection against measles for children and adults is to get both doses of the MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella) vaccine. If you and your child have been vaccinated, it's very unlikely you will catch measles.

However, more than one in ten children in Sheffield aren't vaccinated against Measles, but it's never too late to catch up. We know there are lots of good reasons that children might have missed out on getting the MMR vaccine in school, so Sheffield Children's is running lots of drop-in clinics around the city. Healthy eating classes

Eating well is an important part of your child's health and development. Good diet and nutrition helps keep their skin, eyes and teeth healthy, supports growth and brain development, strengthens bones, boosts immunity, and can even help with behavioural issues.

This session is run jointly by the Sheffield Children's 0-19 Service and Family Hubs and covers everything from maintaining a healthy balanced diet, age-appropriate portion sizes, food fussiness, healthy eating habits, healthy teeth and planning a healthy packed lunch.

Secret sugar

Too much sugar is bad for children's health as it can lead to the build-up of harmful fat on the inside that we cannot see. It can also lead to painful tooth decay – every 10 minutes, a child in England has a tooth removed in hospital.

For 4-6 year olds, the maximum recommended daily amount of sugar is 19 grams (5 cubes), for 7-10 it's 24 grams (6 cubes) and you might be surprised how much sugar is hidden away in our favourite snacks. A juice drink (2 cubes) at break, a cereal bar (3 cubes) in the afternoon, and a yoghurt (up to 6 cubes!) for pudding – it all adds up.

	Spring Term 2
EYFS	<i>Please see Dojo for information about a wider range of activities to support learning across all aspects of EYFS</i>
Y1	Leaf and flower rubbing: Collect some flowers and leaves, place paper on top of them and rub with crayons or chalk to create a wonderful piece of art! Challenge: Can you spot 2 evergreen trees and 2 deciduous trees? Write some facts about their appearance.
Y2	Map of the world: Create an artistic Map of the world that has a focus on the continents and oceans. Challenge: Pick a country from a continent on the map and create a fact file about it.
Y3	What is it like in Sheffield? Create a piece of artwork, depicting the landscape and history of Sheffield. Challenge: Write a report about how the landscape of Sheffield has changed over time.
Y4	Biomes: Create a model of your chosen biome inside a box e.g. tundra, desert, tropical rainforest. Include some of the plant and animal species found in your chosen biome. Challenge: Write a non-chronological report about the biome that you have chosen.
Y5	Blast off: Create a rocket and evidence its 'take-off'. Produce a poster of your rocket upon its completion, and label the forces at play as it sets off. Challenge: Create a script which you can read over the top of your rocket setting off. This script should have information around the specific forces which are taking place.
Y6	Healthy Me! Consider the ways in which you can take care of both your physical and your mental health. Create a booklet or a PowerPoint presentation as a guide to help someone live a healthy lifestyle. Challenge: Write a letter to the Prime Minister asking him to consider something to improve health (e.g. ban the sale of cigarettes, improve free sports clubs in the city).
